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Democracy at Work in the UK

Students will focus on: exploring how the UK's constitution and political landscape functions have developed, voting systems, party and parliamentary politics and the unmodified UK constitution.

Law and Justice

Students will focus on: exploring all aspects of the UK's criminal justice system including the differences between criminal and civil law as well as policing and different types of sentencing.

Living Together in the UK

Students will focus on: exploring how demographics in the UK have changed and developed, specifically over the 20th Century as well as looking at how community cohesion is impacted as a result of changes to migration.

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Power and Influence

Students will focus on: exploring who in society has power; how individuals can influence change in the world; considering how the media can shape public opinion and how citizens can participate in the world.

Citizenship in Action

Students will focus on: working in groups to choose a topic to investigate. They will then complete primary & secondary research before taking action to raise awareness for their chosen topic.

Revision and exams

Students will focus on: preparing for their two written examinations. Paper 1 covers knowledge from Year 10 and Paper 2 covers knowledge from Year 11.
